Clayton Construction - Health and Safety Fundamentals

- All accidents are preventable and an accident-free environment is achievable.
- The health and safety of our employees is the responsibility of managers and supervisors.
- Health and safety must be managed equally with other business functions. Goals must be set and objectives and activities established to get there.
- Safety performance measures must emphasize accident prevention program improvements.
- Behaviors are responsible for most accidents.
- Accidents are symptoms of problems with management systems or accident prevention processes.
- The entire organization (including Contractors) must be involved to achieve an accident-free workplace. Individuals must accept responsibility for their own safety and that of co-workers.
